The Historian's Corner

"From the Historian's Bookshelf" selection for October takes us on a journey from the Battle of Cowpens in South Carolina to the action around the Guilford Courthouse in North Carolina. Our guide in this journey is none other than Lawrence E. Babits, the author who gave us such a thorough depiction of the Battle of Cowpens in his book, *"A Devil of a Whipping"*, joined with Joshua B. Howard, research historian at the North Carolina Office of Archives and History.

Together, these two men have given us a long awaited first rate treatment of this battle in their most recent book, *"Long, Obstinate, and Bloody: The Battle of Guilford's Courthouse"*, 2009, The University of North Carolina Press. In this book, Babits and Howard have produced the definitive account of the battle in a thoroughly researched work that explores the armies, commanders, soldiers, and weaponry, as well as the significance of this too often neglected Revolutionary War battle.

Another factor that makes this book unique is that the authors draw from hundreds of previously underused pensions documents, muster rolls, and personal accounts to piece together what really happened on the wooded plateau in what is now Greensboro, North Carolina. Also, their profuse use of illustrations and maps enhances the readability and comprehension of this work
