# Williamsburg Chapter Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution



By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

Compatriots,

Dr. Edward Crapol, Professor Emeritus of History at William & Mary, gave us a very illuminating talk on President John Tyler. Tyler has faded into the background of American history but Dr. Crapol pointed out several significant contributions that Tyler made for this country. When President Benjamin Harrison died in office, the Constitution was unclear as to whether Vice President Tyler would succeed him as President or merely become Acting President. Tyler seized the initiative and essentially declared himself to be President. This set a precedent for later Vice Presidents but was not formalized until the 25th Amendment was adopted in 1967.

The selection "From the Historian's Book Shelf" for the month of October is to coordinate with the commemoration of the Battle of Yorktown and the Surrender of Cornwallis on October 19, 1781. The selection is entitles "The Day the Revolution Ended" by William H. Hallahan, Castle Books, Edison, NJ, 08837, 2004.

"The Day the Revolution Ended" traces the story of America's victory through the eyes of those who lived it. Using such rich primary sources such as diaries, journals, memoirs, newspapers, letters, official documents, and other eyewitness accounts, Hallahan paints a sharp portrait of events and the colorful players in the war, including Benedict Arnold's seething vengeance, Nathaniel Greene's ability to turn even a retreat into a victory, Lafayette's military ardor, General Clinton's incompetent leadership, and Washington's high-stakes battles as well as the extraordinary bravery of both generals and common soldiers alike.

Read the book and then come join us in Yorktown on October 19. Help commemorate the events and people of that fateful day.
