Williamsburg Chapter Virginia Society Sons of the American Revolution



By signing the Declaration of Independence, the fifty-six Americans pledged their lives, fortunes, and sacred honor. Nine died of wounds during the Revolutionary War, five were captured or imprisoned. Wives and children were jailed, mistreated, or left penniless. Twelve signer's houses were burned to the ground. No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

The speaker for the April luncheon meeting is the well known James City area historian Martha McCartney. Her topic will be *Down But Not Out in Pre-Revolutionary Williamsburg - the Bruton Parish Poorhouse.*

Martha is the author of seven books, plus numerous published articles and reports, and has received six historic preservation awards. Her book, Jamestown Island: An American Legacy, which is in its 3rd printing, was chosen by the NPS as "best in the field" in the book/cultural history category. Virginia Immigrants and Adventurers, 1607-1635: A Biographical Dictionary and Jamestown People to 1800 are two of her more recent works.

May 4th SAR Plaque Dedication

On Saturday May 4th at 2:00pm, there will be a dedication for the SAR plaque recently installed by our chapter in Bruton Parish Church. This is a significant moment in our chapter's history and we hope that *all chapter members and wives* attend this event. NSSAR Secretary General Joe Dooley and other NSSAR and VASSAR officers will be in attendance. There will be reception following the ceremony.

Williamsburg is full of so much history that the fact that Bruton Parish Church is the final resting place of three distinguished patriots has gone relatively unnoticed. The VASSAR Knight Patty Trust provided the funds for this the bronze plaque recognizing the patriotic service of Captain David Meade Randolph, Edmund Pendleton and John Blair. Mr. Pendleton's gravestone is in the north transept of the church building, and the others are in the churchyard. However, their stones are illegible for the most part. The plaque is now mounted on the north side wall of the nave of the church. Both Pendleton and Blair are monumental figures in our country's early history.

Historian's Corner

The month of April's selection "From the Historian's Bookshelf" is the classic tome of Rhys Isaac entitled "The Transformation of Viurginia 1740-1790", W.W. Norton & Company, New York 1988.

In this original study, Rhys Isaac describes the effect of religious revival and political revolution on the life in Virginia—its great plantations and slave quarters, the capital city of Williamsburg, the small planter's fifty acres, and the College of William & Mary as well as the Baptist meeting. He vividly recreates and painstakingly dissects

a society in the turmoil of profound inner change.

The eminent historian, Edmund S. Morgan, bests sums up the essence of this work in his "New York Review of Books" when he writes: "(This book uses) new techniques for making the past surrender meanings not previously available...(Isaac) has set us thinking about a society and its social relations during the period of the American Revolution in ways we never did before".

The "Transformation of Virginia 1740-1790" is highly recommended for anyone seriously interested in learning more about the social context-social, political and religious-of Virginia in the years leading up to, and through, the American Revolution. It is truly a "must read" for the serious student of this period of American history.
