No signer defected. Their honor, like their nation remained intact.

The Sons of the American Revolution recently presented a certificate of commendation to Craig H. Boice of Williamsburg in appreciation for the display of the American flag at his home. Members of the SAR are selecting homeowners and businesses that properly fly the flag daily in accordance with the code requiring night time illumination. SAR member Jay Smith and SAR Chapter Registrar Ron Losee presented the award. Craig's American flag is mounted at a 45-degree next to his front door, as many are in the community. A clever custom solar light connected at the end of the flag pole provides illumination during the hours of darkness.
