

Compatriot George Thomas Copes



Compatriot George Thomas Copes, who preferred to be called "Tom", died on October 21, 2014 after a brief illness.

Tom was a retired Chief Warrant Officer-Four in the United States Navy who lived in Yorktown and belonged to the Williamsburg Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution. He was inducted into the Chapter in November, 2013.

Tom was a native of Maryland who joined the Navy upon graduation from high school. He served 30 years and served at Norfolk; Rota, Spain; Scotland and Diego Garcia, among other assignments. He was a 32d degree Mason, a Scottish Rite Mason, a member of National Sojourners, Inc. and the Yorkminster Presbyterian Church in Yorktown.

He was a descendant of Aquila Thomas Norris, who was appointed and commissioned a captain of the Hartford County, Maryland militia on April 9, 1778, and served during the Revolutionary War.

Memorial services were held on November 2 in Yorktown.





November 11th Guest Speaker



Stuart L. Butler retired from the National Archives and Records Administration in 1999 as an assistant branch chief with the formerly Old Military and Civil Branch, where he specialized in early American military records.

He attended Florida State University and Florida Atlantic University, and holds a M.A. degree in American history. Since retiring from the U.S. Government after thirty years service,

Mr. Butler has been researching and writing a history of Virginia during the War of 1812. His latest book is entitled, Defending the Old Dominion: Virginia and its Militia in the War of 1812, published by the University Press of America.

Mr. Butler is a contributor to the ongoing publication, Dictionary of Virginia Biography, and is a current member of the Citizens Advisory Council for the Virginia War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission.

He is the author of Virginia Soldiers in the U.S. Army (Athens, 1987); Guide to Virginia Militia Units in the War of 1812 (Athens, 1988, Revised 2011), and Real Patriots and Heroic Soldiers: General Joel Leftwich and the Virginia Brigade in the War of 1812 (Westminster, 2008).

He has written a number of articles on the War of 1812 appearing in such magazines as the Northern Neck of Virginia Historical Magazine, Albemarle County History Magazine, Maryland Historical Magazine, and Prologue, the quarterly journal of the National Archives and Records Administration.

He now lives in Williamsburg, Virginia.


