Bronze Good Citizenship Awards





George Henry Preble. The StarSpangled Banner, or the Great
Garrison Flag, was the flag that flew
over Fort McHenry in Baltimore
Harbor during the British naval
bombardment of the Battle of
Baltimore during the War of 1812.

It contained 15 stars and stripes and prompted Francis Scott Key to write the words to our Star Spangled Banner while on a British prison ship.




Our August 8th speaker Michael Cecere Will present: General Peter Muhlenberg A Virginia Officer of the Continental Line

Mr. Cecere will discuss from his book, the military career of General Peter Muhlenberg, a clergyman turned soldier and an admired soldier and officer of George Washington.

General Muhlenberg served 7 years fighting for America's Independence. He first led the 8th Virginia Regiment of the Continental Army. He was promoted to brigadier general and sent north to participate in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown, and spent the winter at Valley Forge. In 1780, he returned to Virginia. At Yorktown, he commanded the continental light infantry troops that stormed Redoubt No.10 sealing Cornwallis' fate.

General Muhlenberg was a man of faith who held the high ideals of his office in his conduct with fellow officers and regular soldiers alike.

Compatriot Bob Lindberg provided a brief history of his ancestor...

Joseph Reading, Sr (1730-1806)

The Honorable Joseph Reading was from Old Amwell township New Jersey. He was the son of John Reading, the first native-born colonial governor of New Jersey, and Mary Ryerson who was descended from the first Dutch colonists to settle in New Netherland (New York) in 1624. In 1762 he was commissioned a justice of the peace and served in a variety of judicial positions throughout his career, including judge of the court of common pleas and president judge of the orphans court. He was a patriot who supported the revolutionary cause in several ways. In 1778-1779 records show he used his position in the Amwell community to lead the collection of "forage for the Use of the troops of the United States". In 1782, he administered "oaths of Abjuration and Allegiance Agreeable to an Act of the General Assembly" of New Jersey to several officers serving in the New Jersey militia.

35th Annual Service of Prayer & Thanksgiving

More people enjoyed this year's SAR traditional Independence Day Service of Prayer & Thanksgiving than at any time in the 35 years this service has been presented. At last report nearly 360 people have tuned into the Bruton Parish Church's YouTube channel to view the virtual service.

When I was invited to become Chaplain for the Williamsburg Chapter, I was informed that one of the responsibilities that goes with the office is to facilitate the annual July 4 service of prayer and thanksgiving. I was assured, however, that it would be a piece of cake because for 33 years the service was held at Bruton Parish Church. Also, the good folks at Bruton are so familiar with the program it runs virtually on auto pilot. Little did I know.

First it was an organ; next it was a virus.

In the late spring of 2019, during my first year as chaplain, we were informed that Bruton Parish Church would not be available for the July 4 service. The church would have to remain closed, as it had been for several months, due to the installation of a new pipe organ. The search began. Thanks to Compatriot Harley Stewart we were able to arrange with Williamsburg Presbyterian Church to hold the service there. It went well and all involved were pleased.

Late last year I met with Bruton's rector to confirm the service for July 4, 2020. Then, early in the New Year, China sent us the COVID-19 virus and within a few weeks' time churches, along with nearly everything else, were shut down. Surely everything will be up and running by July – NOT.

After considering several options it was agreed to do a virtual service and to record it a few days prior to July 4 with plans to broadcast it on Independence Day. On the weekend prior to July 1 (our date to record the service) Bruton's audio/visual link failed. Tyler Meldrum, who volunteers to manage Bruton's virtual broadcasts, was able to secure a good quality camera and directional microphone and the service was successfully recorded. We are especially grateful that we were able to engage the services of Chris Mooney who beautifully sang the hymns and the National Anthem. No one else was permitted to sing due to virus restrictions. Rev. Jan Brown gave a wonderful sermon. We were relieved when at 10:00 am on July 4 our traditional service was available for viewing.

I am anxious to see what next year will bring. Hopefully, we can return to a service at Bruton that will be attended in person by many. However, it might not be a bad idea to also record the service for later viewing on YouTube.



IN MEMORIAM

Compatriot Major General Clyde Wadsworth Spence, Jr.

passed away Sunday, July 19, 2020







Clyde Spence was born on September 1, 1928 in Waycross, GA. He graduated from high school at Marion Military Institute, Marion, AL in 1945 and from the United States Military Academy at West Point in June 1950 with a Bachelor's Degree in Engineering. He served 32 years in the Army, 12 of those overseas, to include combat in Korea and Vietnam, and had command and staff assignments in the Department of Army and Department of Defense in Washington DC; United States Army Europe in Heidelberg, Germany; United States Army, Eighth Army in Korea; U. S. Military Advisory Group, Athens, Greece; and NATO's Central Army Group, Mannheim, Germany. He taught leadership and social studies at West Point and is a graduate of the Army War College, as well as being parachute and ranger qualified. He retired from the Army with the rank of Major General in 1982. He holds the Army's Distinguished Service Medal and other awards.

He returned to the 140-year-old Marion Military Institute in 1982 to become the Executive Vice-President and then President from 1983-1990. He also received an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws from Judson College of Alabama.

After leaving Marion, he and his family retired to Enid, Oklahoma where Clyde became extensively involved in veteran and community activities as: Chapter President of National Association of Uniformed Services; Founder and Chairman, Garfield County Veteran's Council; Judge Advocate, Disabled American Veterans; President of the Enid Noon Lions Club; Regent of the Oklahoma Division of Magna Charta Dames and Barons; a member of the Oklahoma Veterans Council, and the Oklahoma City Chapter of the SAR. He is also a member of The First Families of Georgia and a 32 degree Mason. Prior to departing Enid, he was awarded the Melvin Jones Fellowship, the highest award given by Lions Clubs International. In 2009 he and his wife Mary moved to The Patriots Colony in Williamsburg, Va. He transferred his SAR membership to the Williamsburg Chapter. His patriot ancestor is Moses Spence who rendered patriotic duty prior to 1782 by settling on and defending the western frontier of Georgia from its enemies.
